WHAT IS PRACTICAL SHOOTING?

Practical Shooting is dynamic, challenging, and one of the fastest growing shooting sports in the world today.

Courses of Fire utilize many aspects not found in the more traditional shooting disciplines such as shooting on the move, swinging targets, and the freedom for the athlete to solve the shooting challenges presented in the Courses of Fire.





What makes Practical Shooting unique?

The appeal of the sport lies in the diversity of the Courses of Fire available to the athlete. By offering different Courses of Fire rather than set types, **Practical Shooting** continues to challenge the competitor and to improve his skills.

There are continually new demands to challenge shooting enthusiasts.

WHAT IS IPSC?

The International Practical Shooting Confederation (IPSC) recognizes all the shooting disciplines - Handgun, Rifle, Shotgun, and Action Air (Air pistols).

In IPSC stages, the results are points scored on targets divided by the time needed to complete a stage. A competitor must be the most accurate and fastest to win! Therefore, the competitions appear very exciting for athletes and interesting for spectators!

IPSC Motto


The Latin words Diligentia, Vis, Celeritas (DVC) meaning accuracy, power, and speed are IPSC's motto and form the foundation for competition. IPSC also emphasizes procedures for Safe Gun handling and strict adherence to the rules governing the sport.



OUR HISTORY

In the October 1976 issue of Guns & Ammo magazine, Rick Miller wrote: "Our first step, electing a president, proved to be rather easy. Someone nominated Jeff Cooper, and he was unanimously voted into office." The standardization of a practical target, an acceptable method of power factoring and the definition of practical holsters were the first issues in the 1976 agenda.





For IPSC, the auspicious first step was taken four decades ago by Dick Thomas and Frankin Brown. They jointly convened the Columbia International Combat Pistol Conference (later abbreviated as Columbia Conference) held in Columbia, Missouri, USA beginning 24 May 1976.

Practical Shooting stalwarts who attended from the USA included famous names such as Jeff Cooper, Ray Chapman, Rick Miller, Ken Hackathorn, Thell Reed, Bert Estes, Ron Lerch, Bruce Nelson, Jim Cirillo and Mike Harries.

Safety and Responsibility

To get a start in IPSC shooting all that is required is a reliable firearm, eye and ear protection and a large dose of enthusiasm.

Hearing and Eye Protection - competitors and spectators must wear hearing and eye protection at all times when they are attending IPSC

- To assist IPSC developing and maintaining a worldwide youth program.




MISIA




